	Lateral leadership for postdocs - important tools for prospective managers Postdocs often supervise and lead assistant scientists and bachelor's or master's students during their doctoral phase. In the postdoc role, you are then even more challenged to take on leadership tasks and, for example, to set up well-functioning teams and collaborations with other researchers. This means that you communicate with your supervisor, at a collegial, lateral level and with your subordinates.
	After the postdoc period, they often take on challenging positions within or outside the university, in which it is important to convince others with or without authorisation, to communicate goals in a focused manner and to act confidently.

	In the workshop, you will learn about important aspects of lateral leadership that you and your colleagues enjoy and that is aligned with modern business requirements. Using concrete tools, applied models and many exercises, you will gain inspiration on how to set yourself up well for everyday management.
